

Lead Lick #2 – Guitar Lesson

This lesson demonstrates one of thousands of lead licks that guitar players use for leads. Once practiced, this basic, but effective lick can easily be added to your lead playing...

Lead Lick #2 – Shown here in the key of "A"

Means to bend the string up

* These numbers indicate the Fret numbers:

* These dots indicate to repeat (repeat sign).

* String Numbers

* String Names

(Fattest String)

* These numbers indicate which Fret hand finger to use:

* The barre indicates to place the 1st finger over both notes (the 5th fret of the 1st string and the 5th fret of the 2nd string).

* Note: Once you get comfortable with this lick – practice it with the chord progressions available on our website – go to “Chord Progressions” (the menu for this is to the left of the home page), select the chord progression for guitar players (each will have drums, bass, and guitar on them).

Means Pull-Off, pick the 1st note (8) and sound the second note (5) by pulling off (without picking) - Pick the 1st note and Pull-Off sounding the 2nd note.
